

ACTIVITY 4: STORIES WITH FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE!



Simile: A comparison between two things using the words "Like" or "as"

Ex: I'm as hungry as a lion!
I feel sleepy like a sloth.

She was as mad as a hornet's nest.

Onomatopoeia: A word that SOUNDS like what it MEANS

Ex: Buzz, Snap, Sizzle, Crackle, Whisper, Boom, Bang, Trickle, Jingle, Crunch



Hyperbole: An extreme exaggeration

Ex: "Steven Universe is the best show in the world!" "I am the happiest girl that ever lived." "It was the smallest scoop of ice cream I've ever seen."

Materials you'll need:

1. Writing Utensil (pen or pencil)
2. A piece of paper or notebook
3. And idea for a character and a setting

Write a story that includes at least 1 simile, 1 onomatopoeia, and 1 hyperbole!
